Report for the 2015 Chemistry Olympiad

Fourteen (14) schools asked to participate with over 300 students were nominated to take either the first year or the second year exam. From the 14 schools, 6 schools were put into the small school category with less than 600 student enrollment which included 1 governor's schools while the remaining large schools with enrollments over 600 competed in both the first and second year competitions. The results for each test are given below:
