3-30-31: TERRITORY AMENDED. Following counties given
Council over to the new Virginia Blue Ridge Section:
Allegheny, Amherst, Bedford, Botetourt,
Campbell, Craig, Floyd, Franklin, Montgomery,
Pulaski, Roanoke, and Rockbridge.

TERRITORY CHANGED October 7, 1936, as follows, in accordance
with recommendations of the Committee on Reconsideration of
Local Section Boundaries, which was adopted by the Council
at the Pittsburgh Meeting on September 9, 1936. (See corresp.
with Virginia Section Oct. 6 and 7, 1936)

TERRITORY NOW CONSISTS OF COUNTIES OF:

Albemarle, Amelia, Appomattox, Brunswick, Buckingham, Caroline,
Charles City, Charlotte, Chesterfield, Culpeper, Cumberland,
Dinwiddie, Elizabeth City, Essex, Fauquier, Fluvanna, Gloucester,
Goochland, Greene, Greenville, Hanover, Henrico, Isle of Wight,
James City, King and Queen, King George, King William, Lancaster,
Louisa, Lunenburg, Madison, Mathews, Mecklenburg, Middlesex,
Nansemond, Nelson, New Kent, Norfolk, Northumberland, Nottoway,
Orange, Powhatan, Prince Edward, Prince George, Prince William,
Richmond, Southampton, Spotsylvania, Stafford, Surrey, Sussex,
Warwick, Westmoreland, and York in the State of Virginia.

VIRGINIA SECTION

4-12-37: Council voted to permit the section to rescind
Council the action of the section in giving up the counties
of Bath, Highland, Augusta, Rockingham, Shenandoah,
Frederick, Page, Rappahannock, Warren, Clarke,
Princess Anne, Northampton, and Accomac. These
are, therefore, again a part of the Virginia Section's
territory.
